Getting a proclamation from a City Council, County Board of Supervisors, School Board or other government group is not very difficult and it can be exciting for the kids and volunteers who make up your PTA.



Proclamation Kit

If you have ever been to a public meeting, you may have seen proclamations given out to honor one group or another. In honor of PTA's 125th Anniversary, a proclamation is an ideal way to remind your community of the great work your PTA/PTSA is doing and has done.

In general Mayors, City Council members, Board of Supervisors, School Board Trustees and most elected officials love to have an opportunity to honor their constituents. To make it easier for you, we have developed this kit to help guide you through the process, which includes:

- a sample phone script
- a sample letter
- a sample proclamation
- preparation suggestions
- suggestions to promote/share
- Founders' Day resources

TIP: Make these your own by including the great things you do at your school and in your community in the spaces designated in each template.

Preparing and Coordinating:

- Who is asking? Everyone should have the chance to participate. Coordinate locally so you don't have several requests go to the same government agency.
 - Individual school site PTAs can talk to their principal and see if the PTA can be highlighted at a virtual or inperson assembly.
 - Council PTAs can consider asking the School Board and the city or cities in their council to recognize them during a meeting.
 - District PTAs can consider asking the county/or county's Board of Supervisors and Board of Education to recognize them during a meeting.
- How will your proclamation be presented in person, in a publication, on a website or virtually?
- Who will go to the meeting on behalf of your PTA? Sometimes you attend the meeting and sometimes you invite the Mayor or a Council Member to attend your Founders Day Celebration or Superintendents Round up or another event.
 - TIP: Be sure to have other PTA members ready to snap pictures (or screenshots if virtual)!
- You can celebrate all year so if February is too soon, attend when it fits your schedule of events or the city/county calendar.

You may think of PTA as the welcome committee at your local school, or the volunteers who provide interesting and valuable programs. PTA is proud of its local involvement. But did you know that for 125 years PTA has been advocating for all children with one voice?

Since 1897, PTA has reminded our nation of its obligations to children, and provided resources and important information to parents, families, educators and community members. Whenever the education, health, safety, or well-being of young people are threatened, PTA members are on the forefront of working to resolve those challenges.

Locally, our [PTA/PTSA/PTAs] work with the school community to provide programs and support to benefit children and families.

PTA has been a driving force in the passage of important laws and guidelines that we sometimes take for granted today, such as:

- Creating a separate criminal justice system for juvenile offenders
- Enforcing child labor laws

- Supplying federally funded hot-lunches that now feed more than 26 million children a day
- Supporting school bus safety regulations
- Creating the content-rating system for television programs

PTA has never been shy about tackling tough issues – from talking about sex education as early as 1916 to supporting HIV/AIDS education programs in the 1980s; from including authentic family engagement in California's education code to working with state/local leaders and school districts to get computers and devices, internet access and hotspots and school meals to children and families who needed them during the pandemic. How to make the most of your proclamation moment

Now that you know you will receive a proclamation from the city/county/school board or other, make the most of it and have some fun!

Tell everyone! Once you know the date and time when your PTA will receive its proclamation – tell everyone. Let all your members know. Make sure your Principal and Superintendent know. Some school districts have a communications person. If they know early, they can send out press releases or tell their contacts in the media this is happening.

Document your accomplishment!



Social Media: Whether you receive your proclamation in person or on zoom, take pictures and post them on social media. Elected officials love positive publicity and this is a win-win for everyone. Some suggestions: tag people including the local officials, your officers, and tag California State PTA. Then share the news far and wide. Be sure to take a few pictures: of the group, of the proclamation, of the setting (if in person). If you have a large group, you can go outside and take more pictures with everyone. Post and tweet and take videos too. Have fun!



Print Media: You can write a letter to the editor (LTE) –If you don't know what to say copy and paste your request letter, editing it a bit—each newspaper has a word count for LTEs, but some local papers/community papers love copy and will write what you give them so give it a try.

Local television/student broadcasts/radio: Be prepared to say a few words, someone in your group might be excited to do this. Maybe one of your students (with parent permission) will even be a great spokesperson.



Share your ideas with us: What did you do to celebrate PTA turning 125?

Hang it up: Hang your proclamation on the wall at the school. Ask the principal if you can hang it in the front office or at the School District office and when you hang it up, take more pictures. You can include: school staff, PTA members, and students (with permission)

Include everyone!

Remember when you post or speak about PTA, always invite people to become members. They don't have to have kids in the school or even be a parent. Include a link to your join page. It's such an easy way to be part of our 125-year-old legacy of protecting children and families.
