IMMUNIZATION AWARENESS AND EDUCATIONAL PROGRAMS

Adopted by Convention Delegates May 2, 1975 Reviewed by Board of Managers July 2010

WHEREAS, Public health officials are estimating that an increasing number of infants and preschool age children are failing to receive immunization for diphtheria,

tetanus, whooping cough, polio, measles and mumps; and

WHEREAS, Initial immunization and booster shots are readily available to all children, and

are effective in eliminating outbreaks of diseases which can leave lasting and

crippling aftereffects; and

WHEREAS, PTA is vitally interested in the health and welfare of all children; now therefore

be it

RESOLVED, That the California State PTA, in cooperation with the California Department

of Public Health, provide a comprehensive ongoing awareness and educational program for the necessity of the immunization of all children

against diphtheria, tetanus, whooping cough, polio, measles and mumps; and

be it further

RESOLVED, That the California State PTA through its districts, councils and units promote

a program to alert all parents of the possibility and danger of epidemics and

the necessity for sufficient immunization against diphtheria, tetanus,

whooping cough, polio, measles and mumps.
