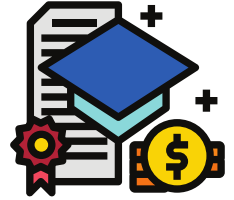




HIGH SCHOOL SENIOR SCHOLARSHIPS

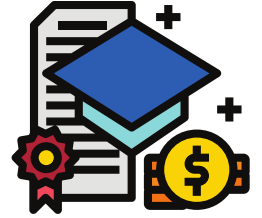
